Staff Comments: Many teachers prefer to not have to distance students during the 22-23 school year.

Parent Comments: Parents have expressed hoping that students with illness symptoms are still required to remain out of school.

Reconfirm how instruction (Return to Learn Plan) is going to be delivered during the 22-23 school year:

We will continue to offer K-12 Face To Face instruction with an option for virtual instruction if a student chooses to learn at home. The virtual learning option must be selected prior to the start of the semester. Per the Virtual Learning Contract, students who have not been successful as previous virtual learners will not be offered that option on a continuing basis. Teachers will remain responsible for providing make-up work to absent students in a manner they find most appropriate. We will take input from CDC guidelines, MDHHS, local Health Dept and MiOSHA in developing guidelines regarding quarantines and other safeguards.

Reconfirm whether or not the district is offering higher levels of in-person instruction for English language learners, special education students, or other special populations:

All K-12 student populations have the same options at this time (in person or virtual). Virtual Learning is subject to the conditions in the Virtual Learning contract for all students. All Special Education students have a Contingency Learning Plan (CLP) completed that specifies how their needs will be met if they are a virtual learner.
